### PVC RECYCLING FOR HOSPITALS


## Setting Up Your Program

To successfully start PVC recycling, there are some key people in your hospital to engage. Fortunately a range of tools and resources have already been developed to help you and your hospital with planning, training and implementation, and evaluation of success.



### 1. Program Support

Recycling success at your hospital will depend on the support of key colleagues. Below is a table that outlines important people to engage early on when starting PVC recycling, as well as the tools and resources available for communicating with them. For some hospitals this takes a few weeks, for others it might be up to six months.

STAFF ROLE	PROGRAM RESPONSIBILITIES	SUPPORT TOOLS AND RESOURCES
<b>Clinical Champions</b>	Liaise with clinical leadership to enthuse, investigate, plan and implement recycling.	 <p><b>VIDEO</b> PVC Recycling In Hospitals: An Australian and New Zealand Innovation</p>
<b>Sustainability/ Waste and Recycling Officer</b>	Champion and facilitate program activities, evaluation and reporting to management. Note this role may be filled by another staff member if there is no sustainability officer.	
<b>Procurement</b>	Can assist in ensuring enough PVC is purchased to warrant recycling and arrange payments for recycling instead of landfill fees.	
<b>Environmental/ House Services</b>	Lead the environmental services team to set up and run collection bins and systems to move PVC from the clinical areas to the loading dock. Also to check on contamination levels to ensure material is recycled and not sent to landfill.	
<b>Senior Management</b>	Acts as a sponsor of the PVC Recycling in Hospitals program and can overcome administrative hurdles e.g. waste management contracts or procurement changes.
